

TIPS FOR EXHIBITORS

1. Clean the pot when showing a pot plant and make sure that the pot is no larger than the stated size.
2. Vases must be supplied by the exhibitor.
3. Uniformity of size when showing vegetables is most important.
4. Vegetables and fruit may be gently wiped with a damp cloth – not oiled or polished. The “bloom” (delicate powdery surface deposit) should be left on all fruit, tomatoes and cucumbers.
5. Beans, pea-pods, tomatoes and fruit should have a stalk.
6. The flowers for the “arrangements” need not be out of your own garden.
7. If a measurement is quoted in the class description, do not forget to check it, because the judges will.
8. Cookery exhibits are to be shown on a plate and enclosed in a clear plastic bag. Marks are given for presentation.
9. Fill jars to the top to allow cooled preserves to settle. All exhibits of chutneys, jams etc. to be in plain jars with **CLEAN** screw tops or cellophane covers. **NO TRADE NAMES** on jars or lids. All preserves should be labelled giving the type of preserve, the main fruit ingredients and the date made e.g. Seville orange marmalade 23.12.16. Taste and set is important.
10. All wines and liqueurs to be exhibited in clear glass standard 75cl size wine bottles and flange corks only.
11. **Staging of exhibits must be completed by 10.30am when the hall will be cleared for judging. Allow plenty of time for this.**

Entrants are urged to read the rules carefully and to take note of details in each class. The tips at the front of the schedule may prove useful.

IN ALL MATTERS THE JUDGES' DECISIONS ARE FINAL

1. All exhibitors must submit their list of entries, with the required entrance fee **on or before 5.30pm on Thursday 17th August.**

There will be a box for entries at the Blade Suzuki Garage, Cambridge Batch, Gatcombe Farm, Newlands Farm, Wild Country Lane and the Prince's Motto, Barrow Gurney.

2. No entrant can enter more than twice in a single class.
3. All exhibits must be staged between 8.30am and 10.30am on the day of the show, or between 6.30pm and 8.30pm on Friday 18th August and cannot be removed before 5.00pm on the day of the show.
4. Except in classes 35-38 and models all exhibits must have been grown or produced by the exhibitor or have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least three months prior to the show.
5. **In classes having fewer than 4 entries only 2 prizes may be awarded. In all classes judges may withhold prizes.**
6. Prize money will be paid on the day of the show, between 4.00pm and 5.00pm.
7. All classes in the show are open to everyone, regardless of where you live.
8. Every exhibit must bear the exhibitor's number supplied and have the appropriate class ticket with it.
9. In all classes presentation is important.

THE FLOWER SHOW COMMITTEE CANNOT BE HELD RESPONSIBLE FOR THE SAFETY OF EXHIBITS BEFORE OR AFTER JUDGING.

1. Container or planter – can contain multiple species
Special Trophy – the Cleeve Nursery Cup
2. Fern or foliage pot plant
3. Flowering pot plant – single species
4. 6 dahlias
5. Rose – single stem
6. Floribunda rose – single stem
7. Best bloom in your garden
8. 5 stems of cut flowers – one variety
9. 1 hydrangea – any variety
10. Collection of garden flowers – 1 stem only of each variety
11. 3 stems of any one flowering shrub

16. 5 carrots with approximately 3 inches of leaf stalks
17. 5 varieties of culinary herbs tied in a small bunch in water

20. 6 runner beans
21. 6 pods of peas – any variety
22. Heaviest marrow
23. 6 tomatoes
24. Tomatoes on the vine
25. 5 onions – any variety but all of the same variety with tops tied down

Cooking and Preserves - Judge: Simon Green

Please remember all exhibits are to be shown on a plate and enclosed in a plastic bag

39. 6 hen's eggs
40. Small hand-made pizza – no bigger than 8" in diameter
41. 6 bite size sausage rolls
42. Handmade tea bread
43. Handmade artisan bread – be creative with shape and ingredients
44. 1 pot of lemon curd
45. 1 pot of chutney
46. 1 pot of jelly – any variety
47. 1 pot of strawberry jam
48. 1 pot of jam – any other variety
49. 1 pot of marmalade – made from citrus fruit only
50. Chocolate Cake: **Bake in two 7 inch tins**
Recipe: 1½ rounded tablespoons cocoa, 3 tablespoons hot water, 6oz (or 175g) butter, 6oz caster sugar, 3 extra large eggs, 6oz self raising flour, 1½ teaspoons baking powder. Bake at 180/350/gas 4 for 35 mins. For fudge icing (half to sandwich & half on top) 2oz (or 50g) butter, 1oz (or 25g) cocoa powder, about 2 tbs. milk, 8oz (or 225g) icing sugar. To finish: a little warmed apricot jam (optional), chocolate flake or grated chocolate
51. Victoria Sandwich: **Bake in two 7 inch tins**
Recipe: 6oz (175g) self raising flour, 6oz butter, 6oz caster sugar, 3 eggs, fill with red jam
52. 6 sweet biscuits – any variety using own recipe

Wine - Judge: Brian Silcocks

All corks must be flange and the wine and liqueur bottles 75cl.

53. 1 bottle of homemade wine – any variety, name stated
54. 1 bottle of homemade wine – white
55. 1 bottle of homemade wine – red
56. 1 bottle of homemade liqueur – name stated
57. 1 bottle of homemade elderflower cordial
